

Viking Tactical Motorcycle Sissy Bar Backpack Installation:



Parts List:

- A Tactical Sissy Bar Backpack
- B Shoulder Strap

Tip:

- i. The bag includes shoulder straps that can be tucked in or pulled out, and can be used as a backpack or a sissy bar bag.
- ii. When you are not using the sissy bar straps, you can tuck them inside the back of the bag.
- iii. The bag may be installed on the passenger pillion seat or luggage rack. The installation steps remain the same, except for orienting the bag in front of or behind the uprights.
- iv. For sissy bars featuring bigger backrests, it may be necessary to detach the straps to accommodate the backrest fully and subsequently re-fasten them.

Step 1:

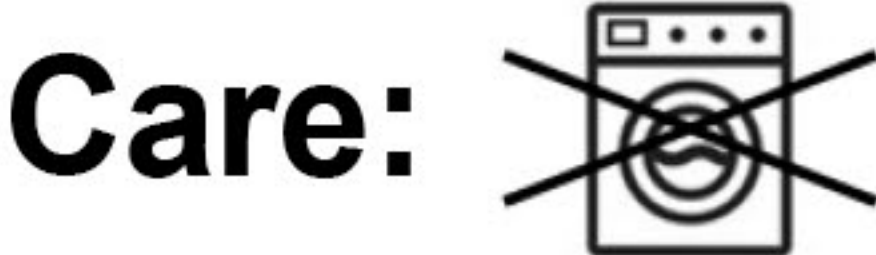
Place the backpack on the foldable luggage rack or passenger seat with the side of the straps facing the sissy Bar/Backrest uprights.

Step 2:

Loop the five straps(four on the side and one on top) around the sissy bar and connect the buckles. Pull straps to tighten. Fold the excess strap and velcro using the strap holder. Refer to Fig. A.

Note:

For bikes with a backrest pad or shorter sissy bars, you may only be able to use the bottom 2 straps. In such a case, make sure the top strap is securely stowed away and doesn't hang loose.



Care: Clean with warm water and mild detergent. Air-dry only.

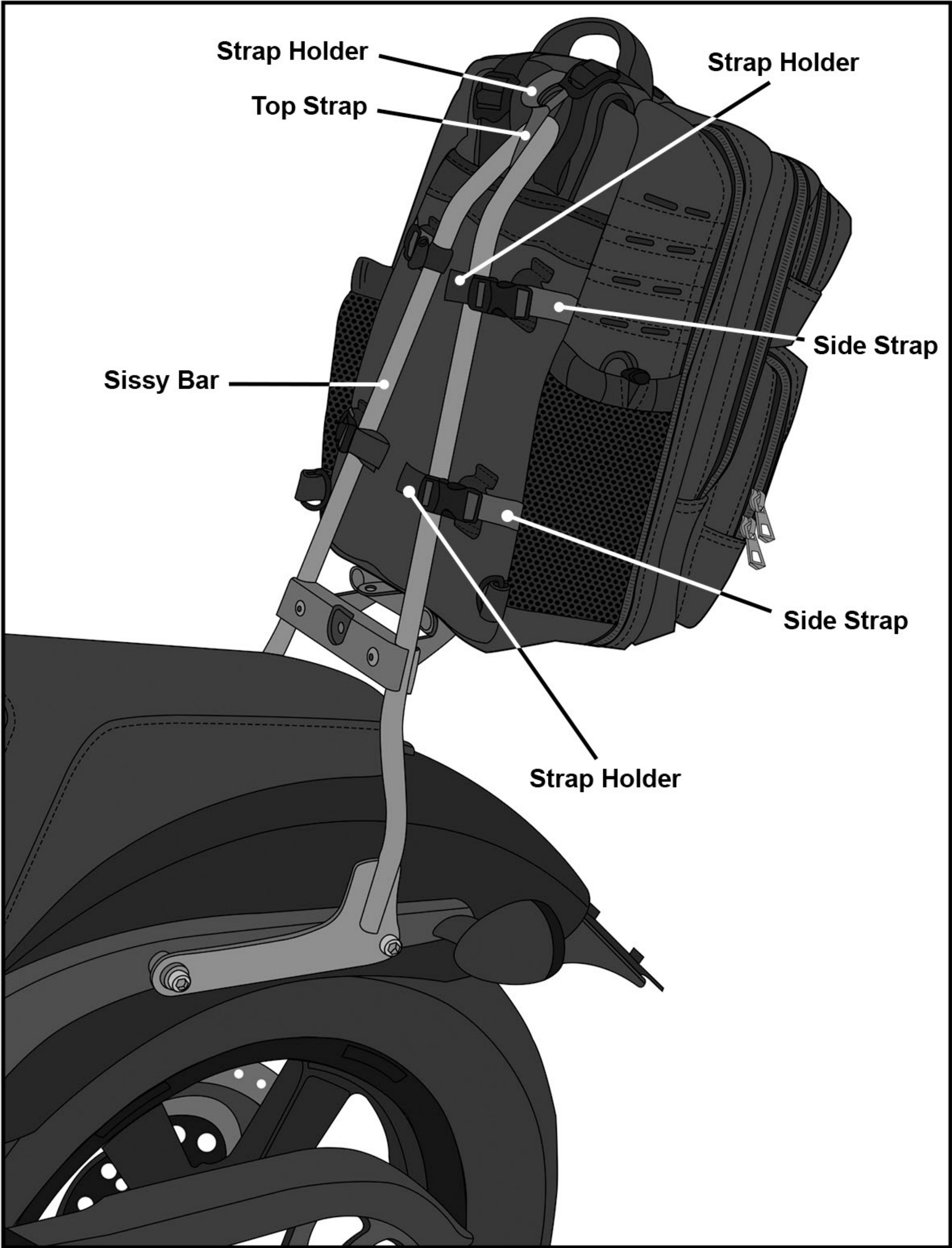


Fig (A) Bag Installed to Sissy Bar
