

Viking Ironclad Solo Saddlebag Installation for Royal Enfield Super Meteor 650:



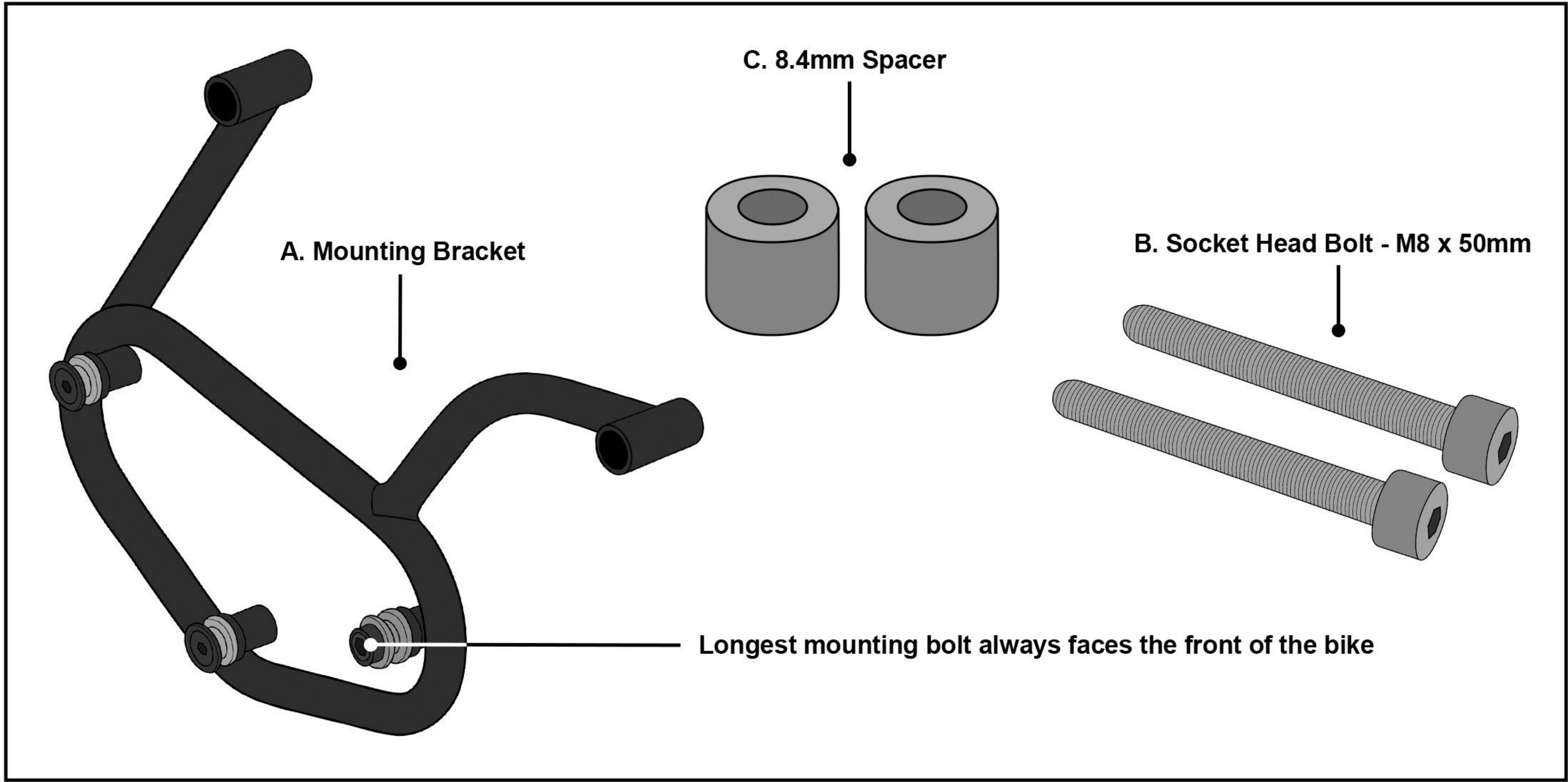
Parts List:

A	Mounting Bracket	x1
B	Socket Head Bolt - M8 x 50mm	x2
C	8.4mm Spacer	x2

Note:

- i. Tighten screws with the manufacturer's specified torque.
- ii. Make sure to use Loctite for the final step.
- iii. This Installation step shows the right-hand side, but the same steps apply to the left-hand side assembly.

Installation Instructions:

Step 1:

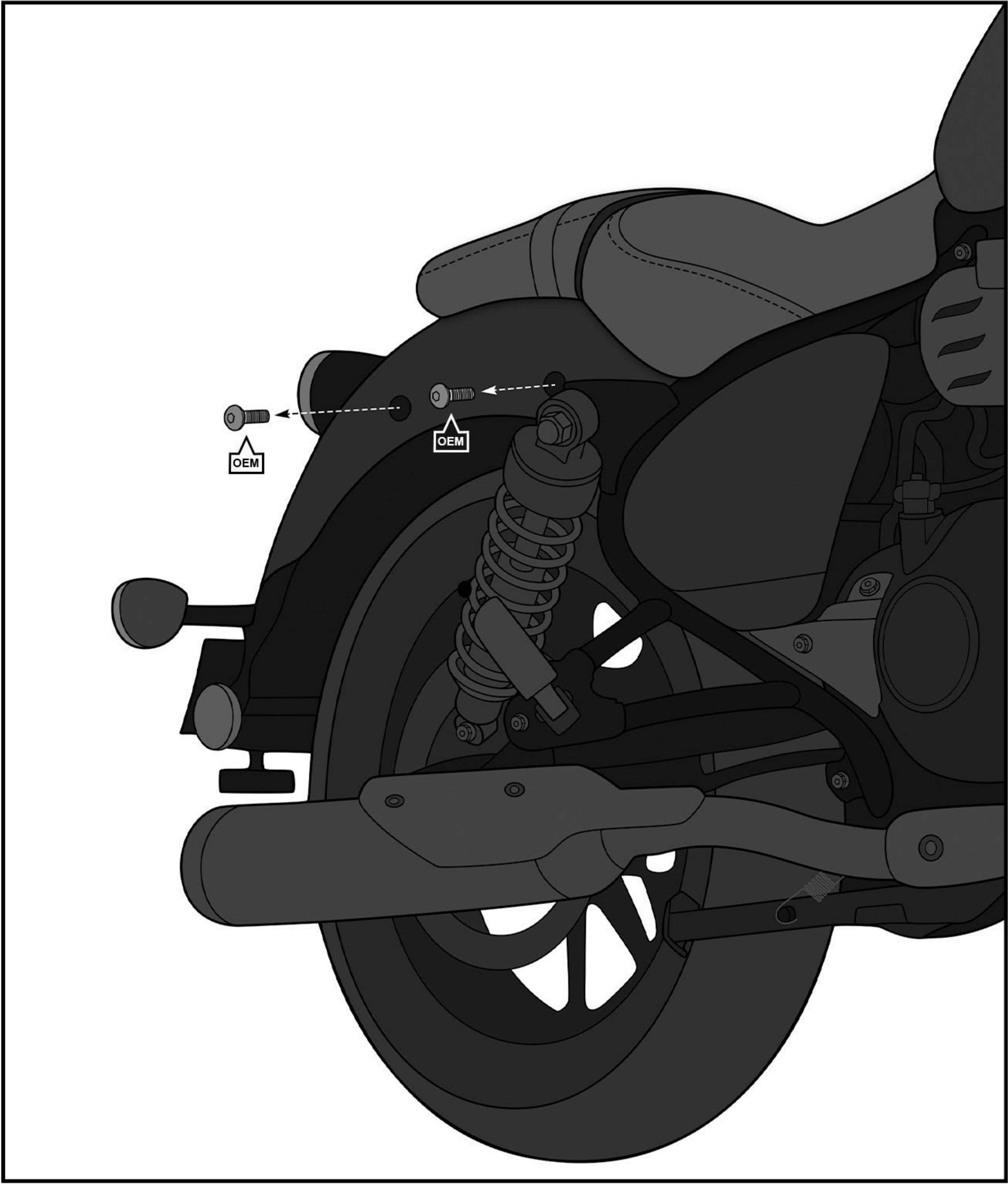


Fig 1. Remove OEM Screw

Remove the OEM screw from the motorcycle. Refer to Fig 1.

Step 2:

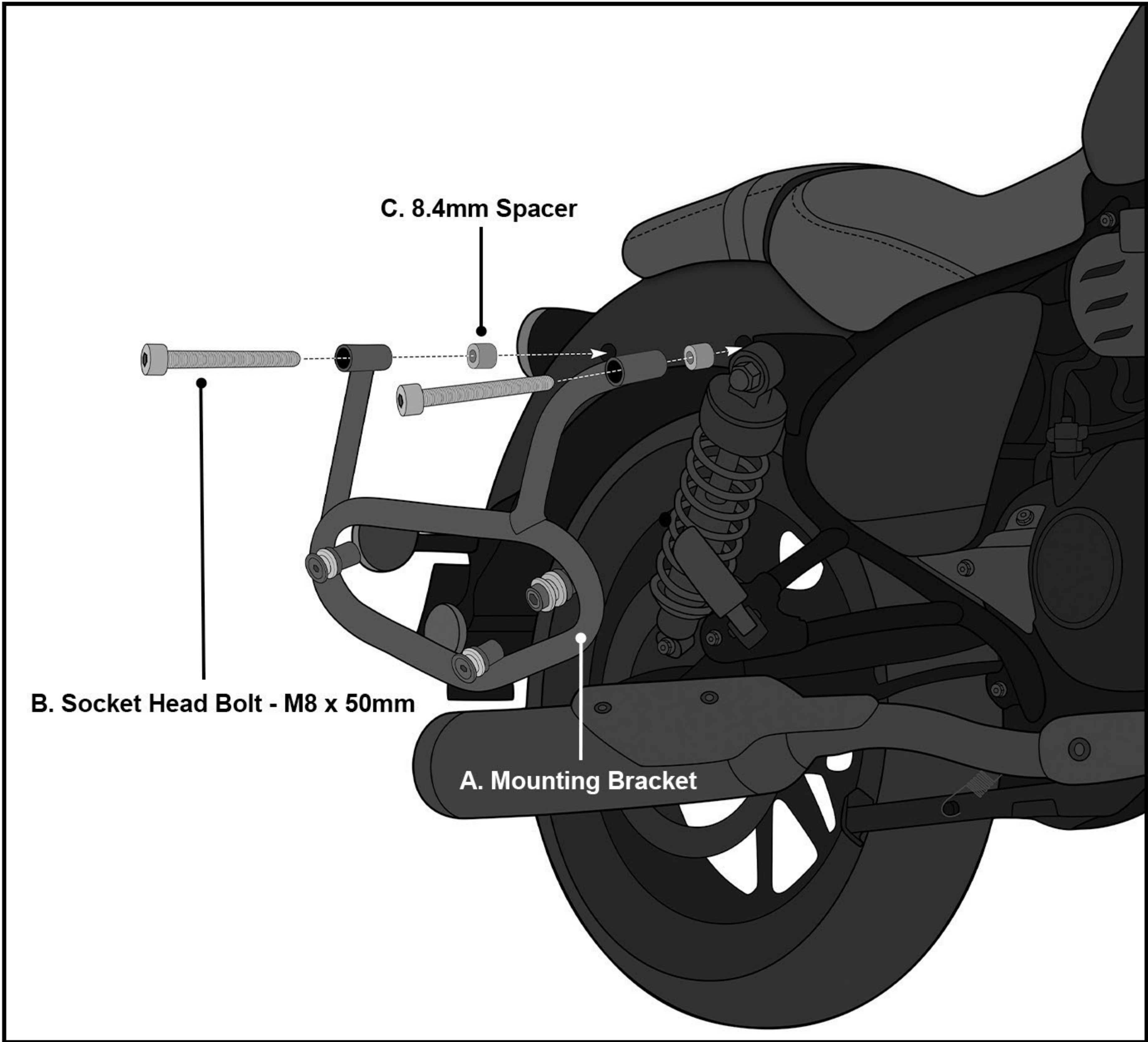


Fig 2. Attaching the Mounting Bracket

Attach the Mounting Bracket (A) to the motorcycle fender using Socket Head Bolt - M8 x 50mm and 8.4mm Spacer. Refer to Fig 2.

Step 3:

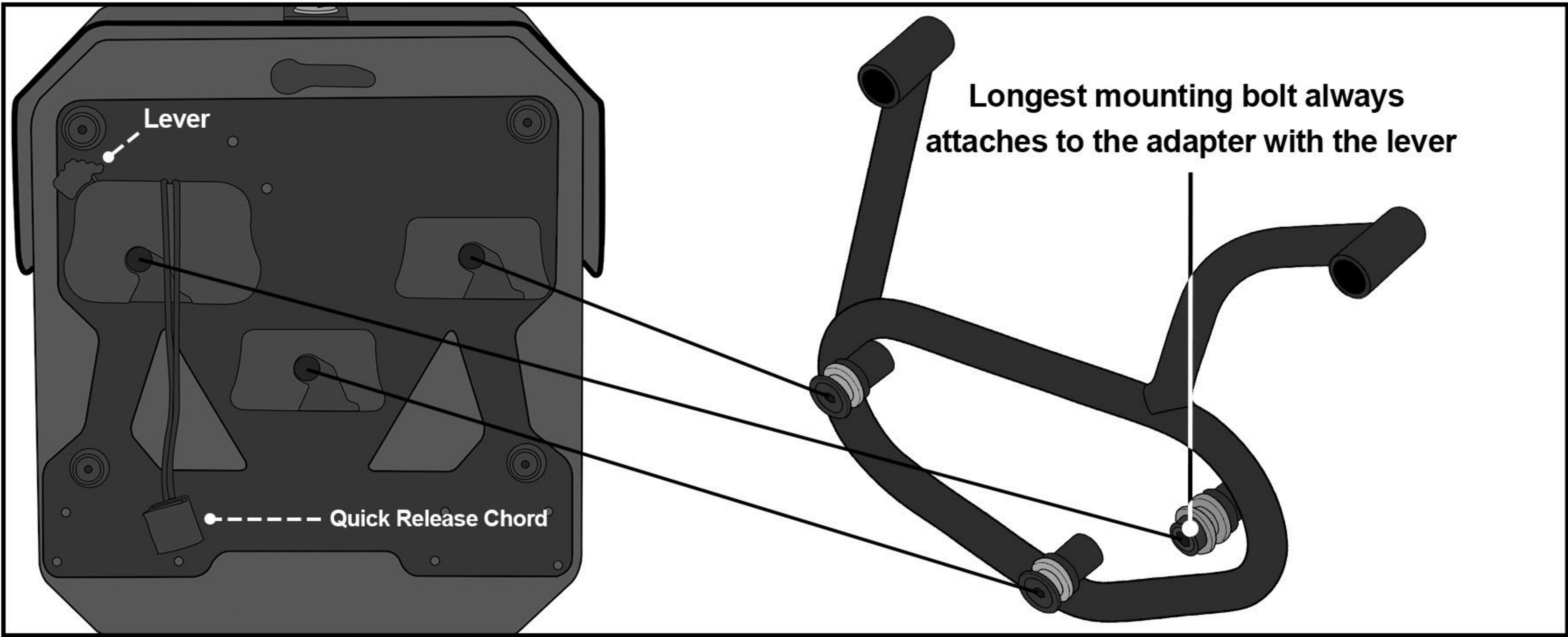


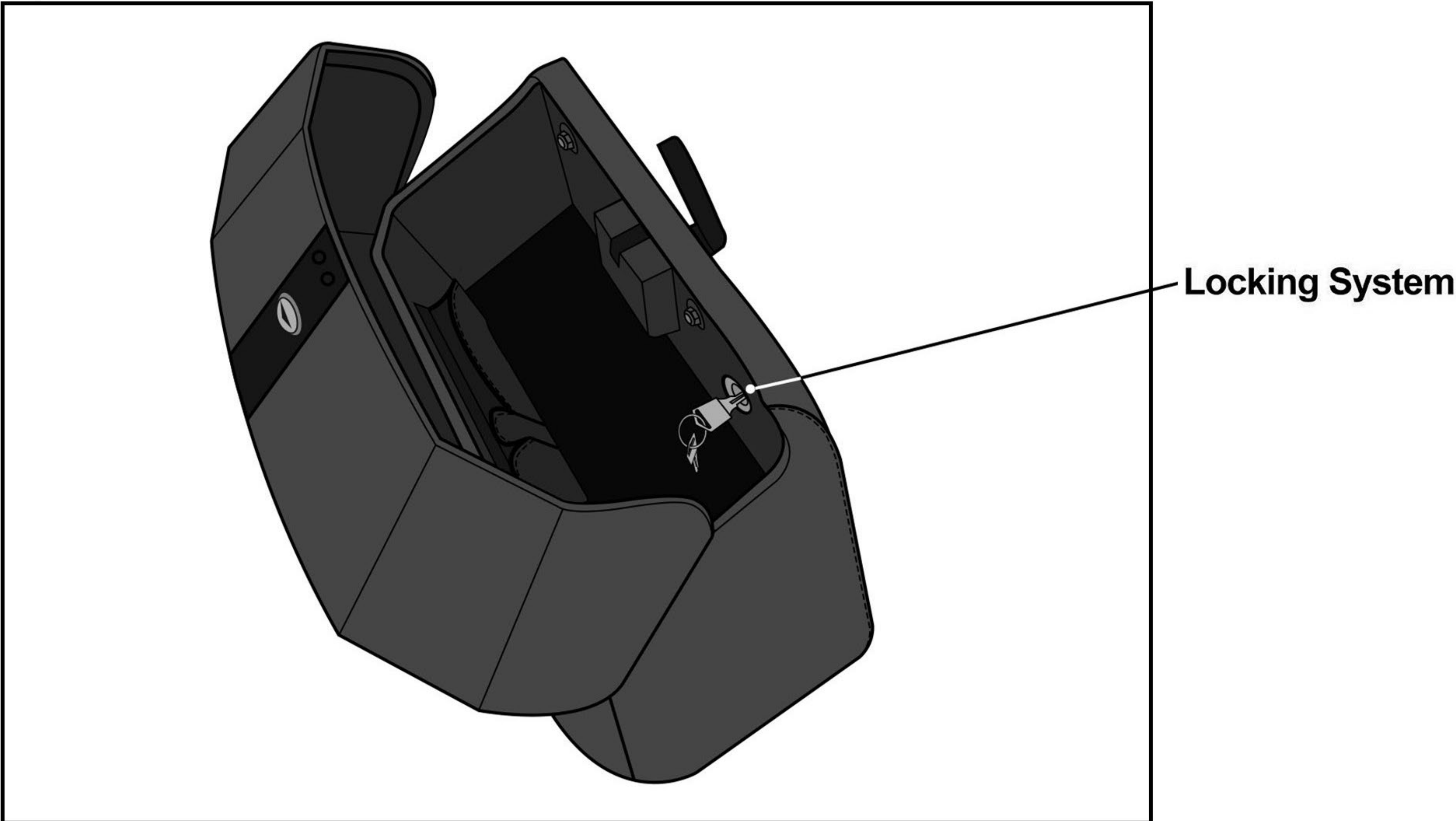
Fig 3. Attaching the bag to the bracket

Use the pre-installed adapter plate in the back of the Viking Detachable Solo Bag to mount it on the bracket as shown in Fig 3. Press the Solo Bag onto the mounting pegs until it properly rests on the mounting bracket.

To release the bag, press the lever or pull the quick-release cord.

Tip:

The quick disconnect system is key lockable. Lock / unlock the quick disconnect system from inside the bag to secure your bag against theft.

Warning:

Always lock the quick disconnect system when the bag is installed on the bike. Failure to lock the system may result in the bag detaching while riding, which can cause damage, injury, or even death. Locking the bag is not optional—it is a critical safety requirement.



Locking System

Congratulations, your Viking Ironclad Solo Saddlebag is installed and you are ready to ride!

Warnings!

- Ensure the mounting peg bolts are securely tightened before riding to prevent accidents and maintain safety.
- Do not install if any of the mounting hardware is damaged or impaired.

- Ensure no part of the bag obstructs any of the moving parts of the bike
